1. Petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in FIR No. 72 dated 08.05.2025 under Section 108 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (B.N.S.), 2023, Police Station Shri Hargobindpur, Police District Batala, District Gurdaspur. This is the first petition for anticipatory bail.

2. Respondent No.2/Complainant-Didar Singh alleged that his eldest daughter-Anmoldeep Kaur was married with the petitioner-Jaspal Singh, 1^{1/2} years ago. After marriage, his son-in-law, Jaspal Singh started harassing his daughter and thrashed her 2-3 times, whereafter he used to leave her in the parental home but the matter was compromised with the intervention of respectables. On 06.05.2025, he left his daughter at her in-laws' house, his son-in-law gave her severe beatings and again left her in his house at about 12:30 A.M.. He also abused his family. On 08.05.2025, at about 09:00 A.M., his son-in-law telephonically called his wife on mobile number-9041142188 and abused her on account of which his daughter

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became upset and consumed celphos. She was the admitted in Corporate Hospita, Batala where she died during treatment.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner argues that petitioner had been falsely implicated in the case. Wife of the petitioner committed suicide of her own, without any abetment from the side of the petitioner and the FIR was got registered by the complainant, due to some misunderstanding which had since been resolved. Therefore, petitioner deserved to be released on anticipatory bail. To support the prayer, learned counsel referred to copy of compromise dated 31.07.2025 with respondent No.2/complainant-Didar Singh recording that he had no objection if the FIR was quashed on the basis of compromise and Jaspal Singh was granted bail.

4. Status report by way of affidavit of Harish Behal, PPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub-division Sri Hargobindpur, Police District Batala, Gurdaspur on behalf of respondent State has been filed, which is taken on record.

5. Allegations against the petitioner are specific and serious. The relief of anticipatory bail, which is somewhat extraordinary in character cannot be granted as a matter of course or routine unless a clear case therefor is made out. No ground is made out to release the petitioner on anticipatory bail in the given facts of the matter. Accordingly, the petition is dismissed.

6. Pending applications, if any, stand disposed of.
