1. The petitioner through instant petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondents to re-issue him passport.
2. Ms. Neha Sharma, Senior Panel Counsel submits that application of the petitioner stands closed on account of adverse police verification report. If the petitioner files a fresh application in view of changed circumstances, it would be reconsidered, in accordance with law.
