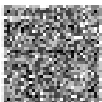

SUDEEPTI SHARMA, J. (Oral)

1. The contempt petition has been filed for deliberate and intentional disobedience of order dated 27.09.2024 passed in CRM-M-43933-2023,
2. The relevant paras of order dated 27.09.2024 are reproduced as under:-

“5. Counsel for the petitioner argued that they have sent the further desired information to the Enforcement Directorate through e-mails but that was not looked into. Counsel for ED contradicted by submitting that a response to the e-mail was sent on 07.06.2023 in which details were asked but they never provided. 6. Given above, the ED had no material to proceed further at this stage and consequently, the present petition is disposed of with observations that in case petitioner has any additional evidence, he may supply the same to the concerned officials on or before 31.10.2024 and in case extra material is supplied which was not part of the



earlier material, then the concerned Officer to look into the same and conduct inquiry in accordance with law.”

- 3. A perusal of above shows that there is no direction passed by this Court.
- 4. In view of the same, this Court is of the considered view that the petitioner has failed to establish any instance of willful and deliberate disobedience of order dated 27.09.2024 passed in CRM-M-43933-2023.
- 5. Consequently, the present petition being devoid of merit and not maintainable in law, is hereby stands dismissed.
- 6. All the pending miscellaneous applications, if any, are also disposed of.
