By way of present petition filed under Section 482 BNSS,
petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR (Annexure P-1) as under:

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in compliance to the order dated 31.12.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioner has already joined the investigation and as such interim bail granted to the petitioner may be confirmed.

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions received from ASI Daljit Singh has intimated that the petitioner has joined investigation and is no more required for any custodial investigation in this case nor he is required



for further investigation.

4. Heard.

5. During the course of hearing on 31.12.2024, the following order was passed:-

“ Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case, who has no other criminal antecedents and even there is delay of 12 days in registration of the FIR. She further contends that the allegations against the petitioner are that she stole the mobile phone of the complainant and transferred an amount of Rs.87,000/- to other accounts. She further contends that the allegation of transferring Rs.87,000/- is false as nothing has been recovered from her possession and she is not the beneficiary further the amount which has been allegedly transferred to other accounts belong to some unknown persons and there is no evidence against the petitioner.

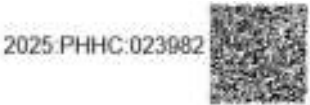
Notice of motion.

Mr. Malkiat Singh, DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State and seeks time to file reply.

Adjourned to 18.02.2025.

Meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation and on her doing so, the petitioner be released on interim bail subject to her furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall continue to join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 482(2) B.N.S.S.”

6. Keeping in view the above submissions made by learned State counsel and the fact that the petitioner had joined the investigation consequent to the order dated 31.12.2024 passed by this Court, interim bail granted vide order dated 31.12.2024 is hereby confirmed, subject to conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) BNSS. Further the petitioner is directed to join investigation as and when required in future by way of written notice for such purpose to be served by Investigating Officer of this



case upon the petitioner; he will not tamper with the evidence nor will influence the witnesses and will not leave the country without prior permission of the Court.

7. The petition stands allowed.
