YASHVIR SINGH RATHOR, J. (Oral)

1. Prayer in this petition under Section 482 of BNSS, 2023 is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.55, dated 21.04.2025 registered at Police Station Sadar Nabha, District Patiala (Annexure P-1), under Sections 326(f), 115(2), 3(5) and 62 of BNS, 2023.
2. Notice of motion. Mr. Jatinder Pal Singh, Sr. DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State. Both the parties have been heard and material on file has been perused.
3. Petitioner is apprehending arrest for the offences under Section 326(f), 115(2), 62 and 3(5) of BNS for having put the crop on fire and causing simple injuries to the victim. However, all the offences are bailable and as such, the application for anticipatory bail was not maintainable. The learned Additional Sessions Judge has ignored this fact and has dismissed the petition for anticipatory bail on merits and taking into consideration the nature and gravity of the offences. Since, all the

offences for which the petitioner is apprehending arrest are bailable, he is entitled to be released on bail either at the time of arrest before the police or when he is produced before the Court concerned.

4. Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed as being not maintainable.

5. A copy of this order be sent to the Court concerned, for necessary compliance.
