AMAN CHAUDHARY, J. (ORAL)

1. Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 483 BNSS is for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.303 dated 08.11.2023, registered under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471, 201, 120-B, 409, 477-A IPC at Police Station Nathusari Chopta, District Sirsa.

2. Learned counsel contends that the petitioner has been in custody for more than 2 months. He alleges false implication. The allegations against him of having supplied the documents to the main accused Manjeet Singh, however, there is no allegations against him of having any role to play in changing the page in the conveyance deed. Co-accused Mahaveer has been granted bail by this Court vide order dated 19.11.2025, Annexure P-6, after being in custody for a month and a half. Challan was presented on 10.10.2025 and charges have been framed on 03.11.2025, however, out of 19 prosecution witnesses, only 2 have been examined. The petitioner is not involved in any other case.



3. The custody certificate dated 10.12.2025, filed by the learned State counsel is taken on record. As per the same, the petitioner is behind bars for 2 months and 5 days.

4. Learned State counsel opposes the bail on the ground that there are specific allegations levelled against the petitioner of having supplied documents to the main accused, who had misused the same. However, he is unable to controvert the submissions with regard to stage, co-accused having been granted bail and the petitioner not being involved in any other case.

5. Heard.

6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case, in particular that the petitioner is in custody for the last 2 months and 5 days; not involved in any other case; co-accused is on bail; challan stands presented on 10.10.2025; charges were framed on 03.11.2025, however, 17 more prosecution witnesses still remain to be examined, the trial is likely to take a considerable time, further incarceration of the petitioner would be violative of his right enshrined under Article 21 of the Constitution of India, the present petition is allowed.

7. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail, subject to furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned, if not required in any other case and shall abide by the following conditions:-

- (i) The petitioner will not tamper with the evidence during the trial.
- (ii) The petitioner will not pressurize/ intimidate the prosecution witnesses.
- (iii) The petitioner will appear before the trial Court on each and every date fixed, unless is exempted by a specific order of Court.
- (iv) The petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to



the offence of which, he is an accused, or for commission of which he is suspected of.

- (v) The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly coerce, induce, threaten or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him/ her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer or tamper with the evidence in any manner.
- (vi) The petitioner shall not in any manner misuse his liberty.
- (vii) The petitioner shall furnish his address and mobile number by way of an affidavit to the trial Court and not change the same till conclusion of trial and if for any reasons, he seeks to change either of the aforesaid, it shall be done only with prior information to the learned trial Court.
- (viii) The petitioner shall not leave the country without prior permission of the trial Court.
- (ix) The trial Court/Duty Magistrate may impose any other condition, as deemed appropriate while releasing the petitioner.

8. It is made abundantly clear that in case there is any breach of the aforesaid conditions, the State shall be at liberty to seek cancellation of bail as granted to the petitioner by this order.

9. In view of the above, it is clarified that the observations made herein above are limited for the purpose of present proceedings and would not be construed as any opinion on the merits of the case and the trial would proceed independently of the aforesaid observations.
