**STATUS REPORT In CONT.CAS(C) 35/2025 PRAKASH
CHANDRA Vs. Mr. GOVIND MOHAN & ORS.**

1. The order dated 12.07.2024 of the Hon'ble High Court was sent to Ministry of Home Affairs vide letter dated 01.08.2024, 25.10.2024 and 24.12.2024 for necessary action in the matter.
2. Ministry of Home Affairs vide letter dated 07.03.2025 has informed that it had consulted other Nodal Ministries and has asked compliance of the order dated 12.07.2024.
3. Accordingly, financial implication in implementation of the order dated 12.07.2024 was calculated @ Rs. 9,04,364/- and file was sent to Finance Department for its concurrence on 19.03.2024.
4. On the advice of Finance Department, the file was sent to Law & Justice Department, GNCTD on 22.04.2025. The same has been received from Law & Justice Department, GNCTD on 15.05.2025 with advice to comply with the orders of the Hon'ble High Court.
5. The file is being sent to Finance Department for its concurrence for expenditure of @ Rs. 9,04,364/- as interest in compliance of the order dated 12.07.2024 of Hon'ble High Court.
