ORDER

17.03.2025

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1. This petition has been filed alleging disobedience of order dated 06th March 2024 passed by Principal Judge Family Courts, North District, Rohini, New Delhi in *HMA no. 774/2017* by which respondent no.1 was directed to adhere to the schedule of visitation.
2. By order dated 1st August 2023, it was directed that respondent nos. 2 and 3, the grandfather and the grandmother of the child will ensure that the schedule of visitation as agreed to (*fourth saturday of every calendar month in children's room of Family Court, Rohini Court from 02.00 P.M. to 04:00 P.M.*) to meet the mother of the child (*petitioner*) would be complied with, however, the same is not being done despite orders of the Family Court. The relevant portion of the said order is extracted as under:



With above observations both the applications are disposed off and it is ordered that the visitation order dated 14.01.2020 shall continue till further orders with minor modification. The parents of the petitioner are directed to produce the minor child in the adjoining children room on the 4th Saturday of every month from

03.00 p.m. to 05.00 p.m. In case of any exigency and if they are not able to bring the minor child or effecting the visitations, they shall inform the respondent about the same well in time and in that case the visitation shall automatically take place on the next working Saturday on the same time. Similarly if the respondent is not able to come for meeting the child on the scheduled date and time, she shall inform the parents of petitioner about the same well in time and in that case also the visitation shall automatically take place on the next working Saturday on the same time. Both the parties are directed to hold the meetings in peaceful manner and not to create any scene which may adversely affect the child.

3. The Court does not see any reason why the said orders are not complied with.
4. Accordingly, the petition is disposed of with the direction that the orders be duly complied with, by respondent nos. 2 & 3.
5. Petition is accordingly disposed of.
