1. The solitary grievance which is expressed in the writ petition is with respect to the continued retention of electronic devices as well as the non-supply of relied upon documents.
2. Mr. Singh, learned counsel representing the respondents, on instructions states that the electronic devices may be collected today itself from the competent authority and in whose possession those devices presently remain.



3. In view of the above, nothing further would survive in the writ petition.
4. Insofar as the non-supply of the relied upon documents is concerned, we leave it open to the writ petitioner to move an appropriate application before the respondent which may consider and dispose of the same in accordance with law.
5. The writ petition shall stand disposed of on the above terms.
