1. Mr. Sahil Chandra, learned Counsel for the petitioners submits that he would be satisfied, if for the present, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the respondents to treat the writ petition as a representation and to take a decision thereon within a period of four weeks from today, keeping in mind the decision rendered by this Court in *Ajit Singh v UOI*¹.

2. We, accordingly, dispose of this writ petition with the direction to the respondents to treat this writ petition as a representation and take a decision thereon within four weeks in the aforesaid terms.
