ORDER

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26.03.2025

1. It is submitted by the parties that the matter stands settled as per the terms enumerated in paragraph no.3 of the I.A. 7911/2025.
2. The Court has perused the I.A. 7911/2025 and also the site plan attached along with it.
3. The amount which was required to be paid i.e. a sum of Rs. 2,00,00,000/- has been handed over to defendant no.2 by way of one cheque in the name of *Ramina Sahni Kumar* bearing no. 000313 amounting to Rs. 1,00,00,000/- and one demand draft bearing no. 503225 amounting to Rs. 1,00,00,000/- drawn in the name of *Ramina Sahni Kumar*. Photocopies thereof, are retained with the case.



4. Order XXIII, Rule 3 authorises the Court to pass a decree on a compromise wherein the parties to the dispute have made an arrangement to settle the dispute. It has been comprehensively stated in the provision that the settlement arrived at should meet the essentials laid down therein, namely, (i) the compromise is lawful (ii) it is reduced in writing (iii) it is duly signed by the parties arriving at the compromise.
5. The settlement has been agreed upon without fear or coercion and the parties appear to have entered into the settlement agreement on their own volition.
6. All the parties are present in the Court, and their identity is verified by learned counsels who appear on their behalf.
7. The Court is satisfied that the settlement has been arrived at between the parties following due procedure and meeting the essentials specified Order XXIII, Rule 3. Therefore, the parties shall be bound by the aforesaid settlement.
8. In view of the aforesaid, the civil suit stands decreed in terms of the settlement.
9. The Registry is directed to draw-up a decree sheet.
10. The civil suit along with the pending applications stands disposed of.
