1. None for the Petitioner.
2. This writ petition is filed on behalf of the Petitioner under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking the following reliefs:-

“i. An appropriate writ/s, in the nature of mandamus or any other appropriate writ/s, direction/s, order/s thereby directing the respondents to consider and grant fee concession/remission/waiver to the ward of the petitioner to the tune of 40% and payment of remaining 60% of tuition fee and other charges in 3 or more easy instalments.

ii. Direct the respondent no. 2 not to charge any late payment fee/penalty from the ward of the petitioner in case there is any delay in paying the demanded fee as per letter dated 10.08.2020 or the fee after grant of concession/remission/waiver etc.

iii. Cost of the petition and litigation expenses may also be awarded in favour of the petitioner and against the respondent.”

3. Ms. Sahani, learned counsel for Respondent No. 1 submits that the writ petition is rendered infructuous inasmuch as Petitioner was permitted to pay the fees in instalments and he has passed out from the 5 year BBA



LL.B. course.

4. Considering that the limited relief sought by the Petitioner, which stands redressed as also the fact that Petitioner has passed the 5-year BBA LL.B. course, no further order is required to be passed in this writ petition and the same is accordingly disposed of along with the pending application.
