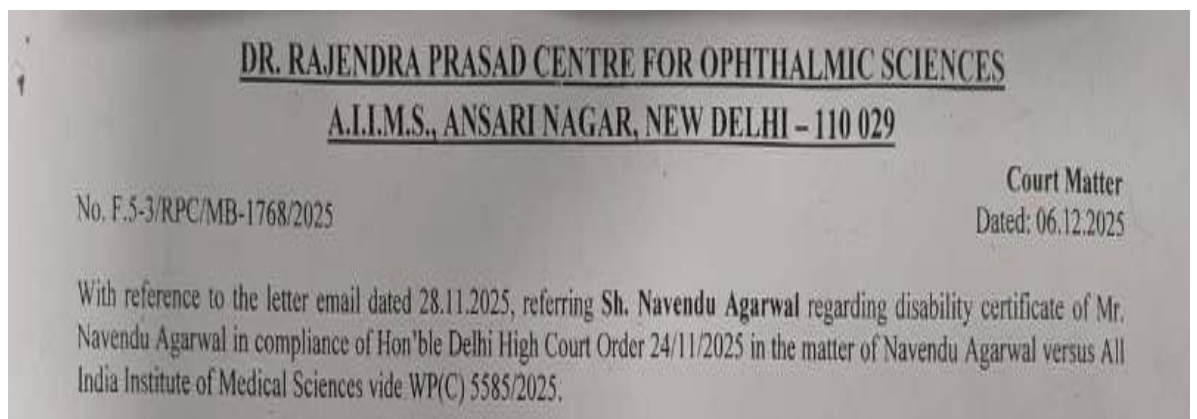

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1. The matter has been taken up on an Office Note.
2. A communication dated 06.12.2025 had been received from AIIMS Delhi in compliance with the directions contained in the order/judgment dated 24.11.2025 passed by this Court in the present proceedings. The said communication reads as under:





On ophthalmic evaluation & investigations done on 03.12.2025, the findings are as follows:

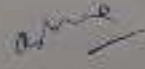
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Visual Acuity (unaided) Distance	Hand movement close to face (HMCF); Projection of rays inaccurate	Denies PL
Near	HMCF	Denies PL
Best corrected visual acuity Distance & Near	No acceptance → HMCF	No acceptance → Denies PL
Anterior segment	Pseudophakia with corneal ectasia	Esotropia, silicone oil in anterior chamber, pupil fixed & dilated, PCIOL with posterior capsular opacification, poor glow
Fundus	Pathological myopia with severe posterior chorioretinal atrophy and foveal scar /atrophy, along with focal peripheral pigmentary changes, no treatable lesions identified	No glow
VER (Flash)	21.1 μ V, 102 msec	No significant response seen
VKG (Videokeratography)	50.90 @ 45°/60.21 @ 135°	38.94 @ 45°/45.14 @ 135°

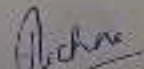
Final impression: As per the guidelines for the purpose of assessing the extent of specified disability in a person included under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, and revised assessment guidelines for Persons with Disability gazette notified by Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (DEPWD) on 12.03.2024, the present visual disability is found to be **Hundred percentage (Permanent)**, under the disability category - **IV b (blindness)**.

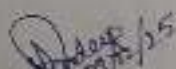

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3. Let a copy of the said communication be supplied to the petitioner by the Registry of this Court.
