3. This petition is preferred on behalf of the Petitioner under Section 29A (4) and (5) of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 ('1996 Act') seeking extension of the mandate of the Arbitral Tribunal to pronounce and publish the Award.

4. It is submitted by learned counsel for the Petitioner that after the learned Arbitrator was appointed, mandate of the Arbitrator was extended from time to time by this Court and lastly, by order dated 25.03.2025 in O.M.P.(MISC.)(COMM.) 266/2025 by a period of one month as the
