1. The present proceedings have been listed on an Office Note, in view of a communication dated 21.01.2026 received from the learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, East District, Karkardooma Courts, seeking an extension of time for completion of the trial.

2. The captioned petition was disposed of by an order dated 04.09.2025 with the following direction:

“4. In these circumstances, the learned Trial Court is requested to decide the matter within a period of three months, under intimation to this Court, subject to the condition that neither of the parties will seek unnecessary adjournments before the learned Trial Court.”
