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1. This petition has been filed with the following prayers:-

“a) Issue a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the Respondent to issue refund of amount of Rs.1,54,39,555/- along with up-to-date statutory interest u/s 244A of the Income Tax Act as the action of the Respondent is unjust, arbitrary and contrary to the provisions of the Income Tax Act.

b) Issue any other Writ, order or Direction which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case.

c) To allow the writ petition with cost in favour of the Petitioner and against the Respondents.”
