ORDER

I.A. 30930/2025 (for withdrawal)

1. For the reasons stated in the application, the same stands allowed.
2. Let the amended memo of parties be placed on record.
3. Application stands disposed of.

I.A. 30929/2025 (Joint application under Order XXIII Rule 3 of CPC)

1. Heard.
2. The parties are appearing virtually or physically, except Mr. Sanjay Kumar Amar. He, however, was present at the time of execution of the Family Settlement. His signatures are affixed.
3. The parties submit that in terms of the Memorandum of Family



Settlement dated 07.12.2025, the suit be decreed.

4. The Demand Drafts of Rs.2.10 Crore (in the name of 70 Lac each of the plaintiff) is handed over during the course of hearing. A photocopy thereof has been placed on record.
5. Order XXIII, Rule 3 authorises the Court to pass a decree on a compromise wherein the parties to the dispute have made an arrangement to settle the dispute. It has been comprehensively stated in the provision that the settlement arrived at should meet the essentials laid down therein, namely, (i) the compromise is lawful (ii) it is reduced in writing (iii) it is duly signed by the parties arriving at the compromise.
6. The settlement has been agreed upon without fear or coercion and the parties appear to have entered into the settlement agreement on their own volition.
7. The Court is satisfied that the settlement has been arrived at between the parties following due procedure and meeting the essentials specified Order XXIII, Rule 3. Therefore, the parties shall be bound by the aforesaid settlement agreement.
8. In view of the aforesaid, the civil suit stands decreed in terms of the settlement agreement.
9. The Registry is directed to draw-up a decree sheet.
10. The civil suit along with the pending applications, stands disposed of.
11. The next date fixed i.e., 22.12.2025 before the concerned Joint Registrar stands cancelled.
