ORDER

25.08.2025

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1. This petition seeks the following prayer:

“I. Pass an order directing the respondents to allow the petitioner street vendor to peacefully vend at his vending site i.e., On the pavement, Ratiya Marg, Sangam Vihar, Central Zone, Ward-S-85, New Delhi without any let or hindrance being caused by any public official.

II. Pass an order directing the respondents, their officials, their agents etc. be restrained from harassing the petitioner from peacefully vending at his vending site.

III. Pass an order directing the SHO, PS Sangam Vihar to ensure that the petitioner street vendor shall not be



forcefully removed from his vending site.

*IV. Pass an order directing the respondent to correct the nomenclature in the column for type of vendor from **Others** to **Stationary Street vendor** as detailed in the vending certificate issued to the petitioner.*

V. Pass an order for quashing and setting aside the terms of certificate of vending printed at the back side of the vending certificate to the extent which is not applicable to a stationery street vendor.”

2. Petitioner claims to have a Certificate of Vending (‘COV’) which is appended with the petition.
3. Counsel for respondent, who appears on advance notice, submits that petitioner can vend only in accordance with the conditions contained in the COV, which shall continue to apply.
4. Accordingly, this petition is disposed of with directions to permit the petitioner to vend as per the conditions of the COV.
5. Petition stands disposed of. Pending applications, if any, are rendered infructuous.
6. Order be uploaded on the website of this Court.
