ORDER

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06.08.2025

1. This hearing has been done through hybrid mode.
2. The present contempt petition under Sections 2/10/12 of the Contempt of Courts Act read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India seeks following prayers:-

“(i) Initiate contempt of Court proceedings against the Respondent under Section 2, 10 and 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971 read with Article 215 of the Constitution of India and inherent powers of this Hon'ble Court; and
(ii) Punish the contemnors for willful disregard and disobedience of the judgment and order passed by the learned Trial Court of Sh. Ravinder Singh- 1, Judge, Family Court-02, East District, Karkardooma Courts, Delhi in HMA No 268/2023 Dated 21.11.2023 as well as willful and deliberate non-compliance of an undertaking given by way of affidavit and on Oath before the Learned Court in above said HMA 268/2023 on 21.11.2023, to abide by the terms of Memorandum of Settlement dated 06.02.2023 and the joint petition filed under Section 13 B (1) of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955; and
(iii) direct the Respondent either to appear before the Ld. Family Court and shall duly performed the term and condition of the Settlement Deed/ Agreement dated 06.02.2023; or
(iv) Direct the Respondent/ Contemnor to refund back to the Petitioner the amount of Rs. 50 lakhs alongwith 18% p.a interest (which rate of interest is the



market practice) from the date of receipt of the said amount of Rs. 50 lakhs by the Respondent to the date of payment and also direct the Respondent to return the benefits/amounts received under PPF passbook and the LIC policy Bond to the Petitioner (as were handed over by the Petitioner to the Respondent as set out in the above joint statement before the Learned Trial Court) alongwith 18% p.a interest (which rate of interest is the market practice) from the date of receipt of said benefits/amounts by the Respondent to the date of payment; and
(v) Direct the contemnors to compensate the Damage caused to the petitioner by her contemptuous act; and
(vi) Any other(s) or further order(s) which this Hon'ble Court may deem fit and proper in the facts and circumstances of the case be passed in favour of the Petitioner and against the Respondent.”

3. Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner seeks leave to withdraw the present petition on the ground that the decree of divorce has been granted on 18.07.2025.
4. Leave granted.
5. The present petition is dismissed as withdrawn and disposed of accordingly.
6. Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
