ORDER

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10.09.2025

1. The present petition has been filed seeking following relief:
(a) issue a writ of mandamus directing the respondent to grant extension of approval for D. Pharm Course for session 2025-26 and to issue the approval letter; and;
2. Issue notice. Mr. Ajay Kumar Singh, learned counsel for the respondent/PCI accepts notice.
3. He submits that an application was filed by the respondent/PCI before the Hon'ble Supreme Court being MA 1593/2025, a copy of which has been handed over across the Bar, the same is taken on record.
4. A perusal of the said application shows that the following prayer was made by the respondent/PCI before the Hon'ble Supreme Court:



“a). Grant extension of the date for completion of approval processes up to 30.09.2025 (qua list of colleges mentioned and marked as annexure A-7) and for compliances/appeal till 10.10.2025 to the applicant/Pharmacy Council of India for the academic year 2025-26; and”

5. He submits that the aforesaid MA filed by the respondent/PCI has been allowed in terms of the above-quoted prayer, on 08.09.2025, therefore, the date for completion of approval process now stands extended up to 30.09.2025 and for compliances/appeal till 10.10.2025.

6. He submits that in so far as the petitioner is concerned, the respondent/PCI will undertake inspection within a period of 12 days from today and will intimate the deficiencies, if any, within one day thereafter. The statement is taken on record and the respondent/PCI shall remain bound by the same.

7. In view of the above statement, no further orders are called for in the present petition.

8. The petition stands disposed of.
