1. The present writ petition has been filed seeking directions to cancel the elections of respondent no. 3 as Member-Library of respondent no. 2, i.e., Central Delhi Court Bar Association ("CDCBA"), Rouse Avenue Courts.
2. There is a further prayer for directions to respondent nos. 1 and 2 to strike off the name of respondent no. 3 from the roll of advocate, as the same has been obtained on the basis of forged and fabricated academic documents.
3. Responding to the present petition, learned counsel appearing for respondent no. 1-Bar Council of Delhi, submits that *vide* order dated 26th July, 2025, after a full inquiry, the complaint, as filed by the petitioner



herein, has already been rejected.

averments made by the Complainant, it has become crystal clear that there is no client advocate relationship between the Complainant and the Respondent, and from the documents available on record and the averments made by the Complainant, the Council has not been able to find any misconduct on the part of the Respondent and all the submissions made by Complainant are not substantiated with documentary proofs. Council is of the considered view that prima-facie no case of professional or other misconduct is made out against the Respondent. Hence the complaint stands **dismissed on merits.**
