ORDER

04.12.2025

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1. By way of the present petition, the petitioner is seeking quashing of the FIR bearing No. 0535/2021, registered at Police Station Vasant Kunj South, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 279/337 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (hereafter 'IPC') and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of settlement arrived at between the parties.
2. Issue notice. The learned APP accepts notice on behalf of the State.
3. The petitioner and respondent no. 2 are present before this Court and have been identified by their counsel and Investigating Officer (IO) concerned, Police Station, Vasant Kunj South, Delhi.



4. Brief facts of the case are that on 07.10.2021, a road accident had taken place by the vehicle which was being driven by the petitioner and he had hit respondent no. 2, who had sustained injuries. Thereafter, upon the complaint by respondent no. 2, the present FIR came to be registered against the petitioner. It is stated that with intervention of the respected members of the society and the family, the parties have now amicably settled their dispute *vide* Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) dated 18.01.2025.

5. On a query made by this Court, respondent no. 2 who has been identified by the IO, has categorically stated that he has entered into compromise out of his own free will and without any pressure, coercion or threat. It is also stated that he has already received the compensation amount. Therefore, he has no objection if the present FIR is quashed.

6. In view of the above, that the parties have amicably resolved their differences out of their own free will, and without any coercion, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them. It would thus be in interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. There is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

7. Accordingly, FIR bearing No. 0535/2021, registered at Police Station Vasant Kunj South, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 279/337 of IPC and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed, subject to the petitioner depositing cost of Rs. 10,000/- with the 'District & Sessions Courts Employees Welfare Association: Delhi (Regd.)', within a period of two weeks from date and the compliance report of the same be filed with the Registry of this Court.

8. In view of above, the present petition stands disposed of.
