ORDER

23.09.2025

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1. Petition under Section 528 of the Bhartiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 has been filed on behalf of the Petitioner seeking quashing of FIR No. 0135/2023 registered under Sections 279/304A IPC at P.S. Mayapuri and all the proceedings emanating therefrom in terms of the Settlement Deed dated 12.09.2025.
2. The mother of the Respondent No. 2/Complainant, who was aged about 84 years, died in a road accident with the motorcycle which was being driven by the Petitioner. Rs.4.5 lacs have already been received by the Respondent No. 2, who is the sole legal heir from the MACT.
3. The parties are present in the Court and are identified by their respective Counsel.



4. The parties have settle the matter on payment of Rs.1.5 lacs out of which, Rs.50,000/- has already been received. The balance amount of Rs.1 lac has been paid today by way of Demand Draft to the Respondent No. 2, which is accepted by him.

5. The parties have endorsed the amicable settlement and accepted the terms thereof voluntarily and they submit that the said Settlement has been arrived at between the parties, without any pressure and coercion and that they shall remain bound by the terms of the settlement.

6. In view of the above facts that the parties have amicably resolved their differences out of their own free will and without any coercion and also the fact that the present matter is related to neighbours, no useful purpose will be served in continuing with the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them. Hence, it would be in the interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto.

7. Moreover, there is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

8. Accordingly, considering the totality of circumstances and the fact that they have settled the matter *vide* Settlement Deed dated 12.09.2025, the FIR No. 0135/2023 registered under Sections 279/304A IPC at P.S. Mayapuri and all the consequential proceedings emanating therefrom, are quashed.

9. The Petition alongwith pending Application, stands disposed of.
