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1. Learned counsel for the appellant submits that taking into account that a period of one year has already elapsed since separation of the parties, he has instructions not to press the present appeal any further. The same is, alongwith accompanying application, accordingly, disposed of as not pressed making it clear that it will be open for the parties to approach the learned Family Court for dissolution of their marriage by mutual consent as per law.
