ORDER

20.11.2025

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1. By way of the present petition, the petitioners seek quashing of the FIR bearing No. 185/2014, registered at Police Station Jama Masjid, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 324/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (hereafter '*IPC*') and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom.
2. Issue notice. The learned APP accepts notice on behalf of the State.
3. All the petitioners and respondent no. 2 are present before this Court and have been identified by their counsel and Investigating Officer (IO) concerned from Police Station, Jama Masjid, Delhi.
4. Brief facts of the case are that on 31.07.2014 due to some misunderstanding between the petitioners and respondent no. 2 various differences, disputes and issues had arisen between the petitioners and the



respondent no. 2 wherein respondent no. 2 had been beaten by the petitioners herein. Thereafter, upon the complaint by respondent no. 2, the present FIR came to be registered against the petitioners. It is stated that with intervention of the family and friends, the parties have now amicably settled their dispute *vide* Settlement Agreement dated 12.09.2025.

5. On a query made by this Court, respondent no. 2 who has been identified by the IO, has categorically stated that he has entered into compromise out of her own free will and without any pressure, coercion or threat. It is also stated that she has already received the compensation amount as per the said Settlement Agreement. Therefore, he has no objection if the present FIR is quashed.

6. In view of the above, that the parties have amicably resolved their differences of their own free will, and without any coercion, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them. It would thus be in interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. There is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

7. Accordingly, FIR bearing No. 185/2024, registered at Police Station Jama Masjid, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 324/34 of IPC and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed.

8. The petition stands disposed of.
