ORDER
26.09.2025

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1. By way of the present petition, the petitioners are seeking quashing of the FIR bearing no. 102/2020, registered at Police Station Gulabi Bagh, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 498A/406/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (hereafter 'IPC').
2. Issue notice. The learned APP accepts notice on behalf of the State.
3. All the petitioners and respondent no. 2 are present before this Court and have been identified by their counsel and Investigating Officer (IO) concerned.
4. Brief facts of the case are that the marriage between petitioner no.1 and the respondent no. 2 was solemnized on 22.04.2014, in accordance with Hindu rites and ceremonies. One male child, namely, Master Kiyansh was born out of the said wedlock. It is stated that due to various differences,



disputes and issues had arisen between the petitioners and the respondent no.2. Upon the complaint by respondent no. 2, the present FIR came to be registered against the petitioners. It is, however, stated that with intervention of the family and friends, the parties have now amicably settled their dispute vide Settlement Agreement dated 20.03.2025.

5. On a query made by this Court, respondent no. 2 who has been identified by the IO, has categorically stated that she has entered into compromise out of her own free will and without any pressure, coercion or threat. It is further stated that they have been living together since 20.03.2025 along with their minor son. Therefore, she has no objection if the FIR is quashed.

6. In view of the above, that the parties have amicably resolved their differences of their own free will, and without any coercion, no useful purpose will be served by continuing the proceedings, rather the same would create further acrimony between them. It would thus be in interest of justice to quash the abovementioned FIR and the proceedings pursuant thereto. There is no legal impediment in quashing the FIR in question.

7. Accordingly, FIR bearing no. 102/2020, registered at Police Station Gulabi Bagh, Delhi, for the commission of offences punishable under Sections 498A/406/34 of IPC and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed.

8. The petition, therefore, stands disposed of.
