2. The petitioner apprehends his arrest in connection with Musarigharari P.S Case No. 123 of 2025 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 127 (2), 115 (2), 118 (1), 76, 324 (5), 303 (2), 352, 351 (2), 3(5) of the B.N.S.

3. As per the prosecution case, petitioner along with co-accused have assaulted the informant and her family members.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case. It is next submitted that petitioner has got no criminal antecedent as stated in para 3 of the bail petition. It is further submitted that the petitioner has married the niece of the informant and the couple are living happily but informant was against the marriage and due to this she concocted as story and lodged the present false case.



5. Learned counsel for the State opposes the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

6. From perusal of the F.I.R., impugned order and materials available on record it appears that petitioner has married the niece of the informant and the couple are living happily but informant was against the marriage and due to this she concocted as story and lodged the present case. Moreover, petitioner has got no criminal antecedent. Injury of the informant is simple in nature.

7. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, submissions made on behalf of the petitioner, let the above named petitioner be released on bail in the event of his arrest or surrender before the trial court within a period of six weeks from today on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned CJM, Samastipur in connection with Musarigharari P.S Case No. 123 of 2025 subject to the condition laid down under Section 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
