APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in a case registered for the
offence punishable under Section 65 (2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya
Sanhita, 2023 and Section 4 and 6 of the POCSO Act.

3. As per the prosecution case, the petitioner is
said to have committed rape with the daughter of the informant.

4. It is submitted by learned counsel for the
petitioner that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the
present case and no offence has been committed by him. It is
further submitted that the very story that the victim girl was
taken to the house of the petitioner and rape was committed
there, does not seem to be believable in view of the fact that the
petitioner is a married man with the family. The petitioner has no



criminal antecedent and has been languishing in custody since 09.09.2024.

5. Learned APP for the State vehemently opposing the bail petition submitted that it is a heinous offence where a seven years old girl has been ravished and she has supported the accusation under Sections 180 and 183 of the B.N.S.S. and further medical report also supports the oral allegations.

6. Taking into consideration the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the seriousness of the allegation, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail. The prayer for bail is hereby rejected. However, the learned Trial Court is directed to expedite the trial as it is a case under the POCSO Act and conclude the trial preferably within a period of six months.
