2 01-05-2026 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in connection with
Garkha P.S. Case No. 02 of 2026 registered for the offence
under Sections 30(a), 36 and 41 of the Bihar Prohibition and
Excise Act and under Sections 25(1-B)(a), 26 and 35 of the
Arms Act.

3. The recovery is of 2593.08 liters of illicit liquor.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner is innocent and he is in custody since 21.01.2026.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that
the petitioner is ready to donate Rs. 25,000/- in some charitable
organization without accepting his guilt.

6. Learned APP appearing for the State opposes the



prayer for bail of the petitioner.

7. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner, let the petitioner, above named, be released on bail upon furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned concerned Court below in connection with Garkha P.S. Case No. 02 of 2026.

8. This is also subject to the condition that the petitioner shall deposit an amount of Rs. 25,000/- in Ramakrishna Mission Ashram, Latu Maharaj Path, Chapra and produce the receipt of the same before the Court below. The bail bonds of the petitioner shall be accepted after verifying the genuineness of the receipt produced by the petitioner.

9. As a condition of this order, the petitioner after being released on bail is directed to mark his attendance at Garkha Police Station on first and third Sunday of each month. Any default in appearance at the police station will result in cancellation of bail bonds of the petitioner.

8. It is, however, clarified that the observations made herein are limited to the adjudication of the present bail application and shall not prejudice the case of the petitioner at



any subsequent stage of the trial and this Court has not expressed any opinion on the merits of the case.
