2 11-05-2026 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in connection with Bagaha
P.S. Case No. 11 of 2021 registered for the offence punishable
under Section 392 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. As per the prosecution case, while the informant,
who is the Sangam Manager at a Finance Company was
returning, two unknown persons ridding on a motorcycle looted
Rs. 1,83,797/- and a Samsung Tablet Computer and a mobile
phone.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the
petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this
case. The petitioner is in custody since 17.10.2025.

5. Learned APP appearing for the State opposes the



prayer for regular bail of the petitioner and has submitted that the name of the petitioner has surfaced during investigation based on the confessional statement of co-accused Rajan Chaudhary.

6. Considering the nature of allegation and the materials that have come during investigation to connect the petitioner with the crime together with the criminal antecedents of serious nature, I am not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

7. Accordingly, the application stands dismissed.

8. It is, however, clarified that the observations made herein are limited to the adjudication of the present bail application and shall not prejudice the case of the petitioner at any subsequent stage of the trial and this Court has not express any opinion on the merits of the case.
