5 08-05-2026 Perused the Letter No. 559 dated 04.05.2026 of the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Khagaria along with the Report dated 03.05.2026 of the Police Inspector-cum-S.H.O, Parbatta Police Station, wherein it is indicated that during enquiry it came to light that both the appellants, namely, Balmiki Singh and Ramadhar Singh, are dead.

2. In view of the said letters as also Section 394 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, which corresponds to Section 435 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, since no near relative has filed any application for leave to



continue the appeal, the Criminal Appeal stands abated and disposed of.

3. Let the trial court record be sent back to the concerned court immediately, if not required in any other cases.
