2. The present petition has been preferred for the grant of following relief(s):

*“(i) for setting aside the order dated
12.09.2024 passed by the Learned
Commissioner, Magadh Division, Gaya in
Jamabandi Cancellation Revision Case No.100
of 2024 by which he has been pleased to*



dismissed the revision application filed by the petitioners Under Section 9 of the Bihar Land Mutation Act, 2011 on the ground of delay for the land situated at Mauza-Barun, Thana No.155, Khata No.200, Plot No.1630, area 2.00 Acre without considering the facts and circumstances of the case.

(ii) for setting aside the order dated 23.01.2019 passed by the Collector-cum-District Magistrate, Aurangabad in Jamabandi Cancellation Appeal No.346 of 2017 whereby and whereunder he has been pleased to affirmed the order dated 06.06.2017 passed in Jamabandi Cancellation Case No.102/2016-17 passed by the Learned Additional Collector, Aurangabad.

(iii) to command and direct the respondent no.3 to pay adequate compensation for the land aforesaid.

(iv) to grant any other relief/reliefs to which the petitioners may be entitled to.”

3. In this case on 15.09.2025, four weeks' time was given to remove the defects.



4. As it was a peremptory order and not complied, it stood dismissed on 13.10.2025.
