2. The present petition has been preferred for the
following relief(s):

*“for issuance of writ of mandamus
commanding and directing to the concerned
authority to refer the case before the competent
court on the point of enhancement of
compensation in light of the order dated
12.07.2023 passed in CWJC No. 2743 of 2023
and several other cases that have been referred
to the competent Court on the ground of parity*



and consistency.”

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the outset, submits that his case be also considered and disposed of in the light of the order passed by the Coordinate Bench in Kumar Ohm vs. The State of Bihar & Ors. (CWJC No. 2743 of 2023) dated 12.07.2023.

4. Learned State counsel has no objection to it.

5. The relevant portion of the aforesaid order passed in Kumar Ohm (supra) read as follows:

“Considering the circumstances, the District Magistrate-cum-Collector, Aurangabad is directed to consider the case of petitioner under Section 64 of the RFCTLARRA, 2013 and shall pass order on merit and shall refer the matter for reference before LARRA, Gaya.

With this observation and direction, the present Writ Petition stands disposed off.”

6. In that background, the aforesaid writ petition is also disposed of in the same term.
