“(i) for issuance of writ in the nature of certiorari setting aside the order dated 25.06.2025 passed in BLT Case No.738/2023 passed by the Hon'ble Chairman, The Bihar Land Tribunal, Patna and also for setting aside the order dated 12.04.2021 passed in Jamabandi



Sudhar Case No. 206/ 2017 passed by the Learned Additional Collector, Katihar and further for affirmation of the order dated 06.09.2022 passed in Jamabandi Sudhar Appeal No. 493/21-22 passed by the Learned Collector, Katihar and order dated 15.09.2023 passed in Jamabandi Sudhar Revision No. 210/ 2022 passed by the Learned Divisional Commissioner, Purnea.
