3 11-02-2026 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and
learned A.P.P. for the State.

2. The petitioners apprehend their arrest in a case registered under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109, 352, 351(2) and 3(5) of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita.

3. As per prosecution case, all the accused persons including the petitioners abused and assaulted the husband of the informant, her nephew and Prem Kumar Manjhi, due to which, they sustained injuries.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners are innocent and have falsely been implicated in the present case due to village rivalry. Further submission is that the F.I.R. has been lodged after a delay of three days without any plausible reason. The nature of the injuries to the injured are



simple. He next submits that similarly situated co-accused persons, namely, Chhotan Manjhi @ Chhotan Kumar and Hariom Manjhi have already been granted bail by a Co-ordinate Bench of this Court *vide* order dated 21.01.2026 passed in Cr. Misc. No. 72027 of 2025. Petitioners have no criminal antecedent and they undertake to cooperate in the investigation and trial.

5. Learned A.P.P. appearing on behalf of the State opposed the bail application.

6. Having considered the facts and circumstances of the case and submissions of learned counsel for the parties, let the above named petitioners be released on bail, in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court below within a period of six weeks from today, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Judicial Magistrate-I, Siwan in connection with Nautan P.S. Case No. 121 of 2025, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482(2) of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita.
