ORAL ORDER

2 16-01-2026 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned APP
for the State.

2. The petitioner seeks bail in connection with
Sahiyara P.S. Case No. 54 of 2024 instituted for the offence
under Section 395 of the Indian Penal Code.

3. The prosecution case is that on 28.04.2024
midnight, 7–10 armed miscreants forcibly entered the houses of
Vishwanath Singh and Ranjan Kumar, threatened their families
at gunpoint, assaulted them, and looted cash, jewellery, and
valuables. After locking the victims inside, the accused fled with
the looted articles.

4. It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner
that the petitioner is in custody since 15.07.2024. Petitioner



bears ten criminal antecedents, as per disclosure made in paragraph No. 3 of the bail application.

5. It has been further submitted by the petitioner's counsel that petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present case. Petitioner is not named in the FIR. Name of the petitioner has surfaced in this case on the basis of confessional statement of the co-accused. Nothing has been recovered from the conscious possession of the petitioner. Charge sheet has already been submitted in this case. Other co-accused has been granted bail by this Court vide order dated 16.04.2025, passed in Cr. Misc. No. 19024 of 2025.

6. Learned A.P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for grant of bail to the petitioner.

7. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, period of custody of the petitioner, claim based on parity and charge sheet being submitted, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner.

8. Let the petitioner be released on bail, ***after framing of charge, if not already framed***, on furnishing bail bonds of Rs. 15,000/- (Fifteen Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Court below/concerned Court in connection with Sahiyara P.S. Case No. 54 of 2024, subject to



the following conditions:

(I) One of the bailors shall be own/close member of the family of the petitioner.

(II) The petitioner shall appear on each and every date fixed at the trial. In case of default in such appearance on two consecutive dates, the Trial Court will have liberty to cancel the bail bonds of the petitioner.
