**C.R.M (A) 114 of 2026**

In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Chopra PS Case No.611/2025 dated 30.07.2025 under Sections 21(c)/29 of the NDPS Act.

Report filed on behalf of the State is taken on record.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that the only material available against the present petitioner is the statement of a co-accused, which is not admissible in evidence.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State relies on the case diary and opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. However, he submits that in the further report filed on behalf of the Officer, there is no criminal antecedent or money trail or phone call record to implicate the present petitioner.

In view of the above, the petitioner has been able to rebut the restrictions contained in Section 37 of the NDPS Act and in considering the materials available in the case diary and the fact

that charge sheet has already been submitted, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the present petitioner.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition that the petitioner shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses or tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever and shall surrender before the learned jurisdictional Court and pray for bail within four weeks from this date and shall attend the jurisdictional Court regularly.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.

The personal appearance of the Investigating Officer is noted and is dispensed with.
