Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that there was a delay in lodging the FIR. There are case and counter case. Injuries were sustained by both sides. However, none of the injuries was grievous in nature. Some other co-accused were granted anticipatory bail.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State strongly opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. He submits that the victim received several injuries, including a fracture injury on the finger. It was the present petitioner who had inflicted the particular blow.

Considering the above and the other incriminating materials available in the case diary, I do not consider this to be a fit case for granting anticipatory bail.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, rejected.
