2. Ms. Sohini Samanta, learned counsel for the petitioner and Mr. Dhirodatta Chaudhuri, learned counsel for the respondent, are present.
3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner assailed the disciplinary proceeding before the Tribunal in the instant O.A. 350/1472/2025, which was not entertained.
