Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits that other than the statements of a co-accused, there is no other incriminating material available against the petitioner. Charge sheet has already been filed.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State files a report, which is taken on record. He opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail and submits that other than the Statements of co-accused, there are CDR and SDR records showing frequent phone conversations between the present petitioner and the other principal co-accused at the relevant time.

Considering the above and the other incriminating materials available in the case diary and the restriction contained in Section 37 of the NDPS Act, I do not consider this to be a fit case for granting anticipatory bail.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, rejected.
