Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners submits as follows. The petitioners are being falsely implicated in this case. Charge sheet has already been submitted.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the de facto complainant opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State relies on the case diary and opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. He submits that there are statements of witnesses that have clearly named the petitioners as some of the assailants. Proclamation and attachment have already been issued against the present petitioners.

Considering the above, the other incriminating materials available in the case diary and the fact that proclamation and attachment have

already been issued against the present petitioners, I do not consider that this is to be a fit case for granting anticipatory bail.

Accordingly, the application for anticipatory bail of the petitioners is rejected.
