Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits as follows. The petitioner is an ASI of police. The alleged victim and her husband had a dispute in 2020. A G.D. entry was lodged and the petitioner was the Enquiry Officer therein. He rescued her. Thereafter, a relationship developed and the two went to different places together. Subsequently, the lady went back to her husband and then both of them wanted to extort money from the petitioner. They assaulted the petitioner's mother on a particular occasion. This prompted the petitioner to lodge an FIR on 02.02.2025. As a counter blast, the present FIR was lodged on 23.11.2025.

Learned Amicus assisting the State relies on the case diary and opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. He relies on the statements of the alleged victim and other witnesses, including the guest house owner where the two had gone earlier and the medical report.

Considering the above, the other materials available in the case diary, the fact that there is an earlier case instituted by the petitioner

against the de facto complainant and others and the fact that there was some kind of relationship between the two for a certain length of time, I do not think that custodial interrogation of the petitioner is required in this case and I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer and also be subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482(2) of the BNSS, 2023 and on further conditions that the petitioner shall co-operate with the investigation and shall not threaten or intimidate the witnesses. The petitioner shall meet the Investigating Officer once a week till submission of report in final form.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
