Learned advocate for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is a tenant of the premises, as such, has been inadvertently arrested by the police authorities. Additionally, it is submitted that the petitioner is in custody for five months seventeen days.

Learned advocate for the State has drawn the attention of the court to the statement of one of the victims - who is a minor. The minor statement do implicate the present petitioner in the alleged offence. There are other issues which do reveal exploitation of the minors and the other women in flesh trade.

Learned advocate for the defacto-complainant is present and opposes the prayer for bail.

Having considered the gravity of the offence and the complicity of the present petitioner, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail.

Hence, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is **Rejected.**

Accordingly, CRM(M) 592 of 2026 is **dismissed.**
