Learned advocate for the petitioner submits that there has been hardly any progress in the case pursuant to the order passed on 06.11.2025.

Learned advocate for the NCB, on the other hand, refers to last of the orders wherein it reflects that regular Presiding Officer is not available, as such, trial could not proceed.

Having considered the same as also taking into account the huge volumn of contraband which has been recovered, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail at this stage.

Hence, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is
Rejected.

However, the prosecution is directed to complete the trial within four months of the learned trial court/Special Court resuming duties.

Accordingly, CRM(NDPS) 500 of 2026 is **dismissed**.
