In Re:- An application for anticipatory bail under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 in connection with Khanakul PS Case No.405/2024 dated 15.07.2024 under Sections 126(2)/115(2)/118(2)/109/76/79/351(2)/3(5) of the BNS, 2023.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submits as follows. The petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case. The principal accused against whom, there is an allegation of causing physical harm, was arrested.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State opposes the prayer for anticipatory bail. He relies on the statements of the victims and other witnesses, seizure list and the two injury reports, which, however, do not show infliction of any grievous injury.

Considering the above and the other materials available in the case diary, I am inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bond of Rs.10,000/- with two

sureties of like amount each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer and subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, corresponding to Section 482 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and on further condition that the petitioner shall cooperate with the investigation and shall not threaten or intimidate witnesses or tamper with evidence in any manner whatsoever and the petitioner shall meet the Investigating Officer once a week till submission of report in final form.

The application for anticipatory bail is, thus, disposed of.
