In Re : An Application for bail under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 corresponding to Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 filed in connection with Lokepur Police Station Case No. 42 of 2024 dated 22.05.2024 under Sections 447/325/326/307/354/34 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (G.R. Case No. 268 of 2024).

Learned advocate appearing for the petitioners submits that other accused persons have been granted bail. Petitioners are similarly situated as the other accused persons who have been granted bail. Petitioners are in custody for 122 days.

Learned advocate appearing for the State, on the other hand, opposes the prayer for bail.

I have taken into account the earlier orders passed by this Court and the period of detention of the present petitioners. Having considered the same, the present petitioners viz., 1. **Sekh Nokul @ Sekh Nakul @ Sekh Makul**, 2. **Sekh Haradhan** and 3. **Sekh Islam** be released on bail by the learned Trial Court on the same terms and conditions as the other accused viz. Sk. Jan Ali who has been granted bail by

the Hon'ble Division Bench on 14.02.2025 in CRM (DB) 3908 of 2024.

Accordingly, the prayer for bail of the petitioners is **allowed.**

Memo of Evidence submitted by the learned advocate appearing for the State be kept with the record.

The application for bail, being CRM (M) 882 of 2026, is, thus, disposed of.
