Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits
that the petitioner is in custody for more than 7 and half
months and has been implicated on the basis of alleged
recovery of 618 Gms. of Brown Sugar. Prosecution, till date,
could not commence the witness action and has relied upon
number of witnesses in order to prove its case.

Learned advocate for the State opposes the prayer for
bail and submits that commercial quantity of contraband has
been recovered in the present case.

Having considered the rigors of Section 37 of the NDPS
Act being attracted, in the present case, at this stage, without

granting opportunity to the prosecution to adduce the evidence, I am not inclined to release the petitioner on bail. As such, prayer for bail of the petitioner in CRM (NDPS) 1015 of 2026 is **rejected.**

However, the learned Trial Court would expedite the process of trial and ensure the same is taken to its logical conclusion within a reasonable period of time.
