1. During the course of submissions, it has been submitted that the chargesheet has already been filed.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has fairly submitted that the matter may be relegated back to the learned Trial Court. However, an appropriate direction may be issued for the expeditious disposal of the discharge application, to be filed by the petitioner, expeditiously, after giving an opportunity to the parties of being heard as the petitioner is not well.
3. Learned counsel for the private opposite party has refuted the averments on merits. However, this Court is not going at all on the merits of the case.

4. Since the chargesheet has been filed, liberty is granted to the petitioner to file a discharge application before the learned Trial Court.
5. Learned Trial Court shall decide the same expeditiously, without granting any unnecessary adjournment, in accordance with law, after giving an opportunity to the parties of being heard.
6. Hence, the petition stands disposed of.
7. All pending applications, if any, shall stand disposed of.
8. All parties shall act on the basis of the server copy of this order duly downloaded from the official website of this Court.
