1. Affidavit of service filed on behalf of the petitioner is taken on record.
2. By the present writ petition the petitioner seeks direction upon the respondent authorities for disbursement of interest on delayed payment of revised gratuity and arrear pension @ 18% per annum from the date of effect of ROPA 2019 till the date of actual payment.
3. The petitioner contends that he was appointed as a Head Teacher of Narayanpur Daspara F.P. School, Narayanpur, District-Purba Bardhaman. The petitioner retired from service on superannuation on 30th November, 2017. The first Pension Payment Order was issued in favour of the petitioner on 3rd January, 2018. The revised Pension Payment Order as per ROPA 2019 was issued on 17th June, 2021. The revised gratuity amount and arrear pension was

paid to the petitioner on 22nd August, 2021. However, no interest has been paid on the delayed payment of revised gratuity and arrear pension. Hence this writ petition.

4. Mr. Krishna Keshab Paul, learned advocate for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is entitled to interest on the revised gratuity and arrear pension from 14th February, 2020 as per ROPA 2019, which has only been disbursed only on 22nd August, 2021. He seeks for appropriate orders.
5. Ms. Ashima Das (Sil), learned advocate for the State submits that the petitioner has categorically stated that he does not claim any interest in respect of the provisional gratuity and arrear pension.
6. From the contention made in the writ petition, it is found that the petitioner is entitled to revised gratuity and arrear pension under ROPA, 2019 with effect from 14th February, 2020. The revised gratuity and arrear pension amount was disbursed to the petitioner belatedly. In view of the above, the petitioner is entitled to receive interest on revised gratuity and arrear pension from date of effect of ROPA, 2019.
7. Accordingly, respondent no.2, Director of Pension, Provident Fund and Group Insurance, Government of West Bengal and respondent no.4, Treasury Officer, Katwa are directed to pay the interest at the rate of interest @ 8% per annum on the revised gratuity and

arrear pension in favour of the petitioner on and from the date of effect of ROPA, 2019 i.e. 14th February, 2020 till the date of actual payment. Such payment is to be made within a period of eight weeks from the date of communication of this order.

8. Learned advocate for the petitioner is directed to communicate this order to the respondent no.2, Director of Pension, Provident Fund and Group Insurance, Government of West Bengal and respondent no.4, Treasury Officer, Katwa for necessary action.
9. With the aforesaid directions, the writ petition being **WPA 18145 of 2025** is disposed of.
10. Since no affidavits have been called for, the allegation made in the writ petition is deemed to be not admitted.
11. Interim order, if any, stands vacated.
12. All connected applications, if any, stand disposed of.
13. There shall be no order as to costs.
14. All concerned parties shall act in terms of the copy of the order duly downloaded from the official website of this Court.
15. Urgent Photostat certified copy of the order, if applied for, be given to the parties on compliance of all necessary legal formalities.
