Learned advocate appearing for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is similarly placed as the other accused person who has been granted bail in CRM (M) 2135 of 2025.

Learned advocate appearing for the State, on the other hand, opposes the prayer for bail, but is unable to refute the contention of the petitioner on the issue of parity.

Having considered the same, I am inclined to release the petitioner on bail. As such, the prayer for bail of the petitioner is **allowed**.

Accordingly, the petitioner viz., **Amir Sk @ Jhoni** shall be released on bail upon furnishing bond of Rs.20,000/-, with two sureties of Rs.10,000/- each, one of whom must be local, to the satisfaction of the learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Jangipur.

If on bail, the petitioner shall be physically present on each and every date so fixed by the learned Trial Court and shall not leave the jurisdiction of the district of Murshidabad without prior permission of the learned Trial Court.

The application for bail, being CRM (M) 2461 of 2025, is, thus, disposed of.
